

FAITH FOR LIFE SPEAKER

Chap Clark will be at Calvary, February 21, at 6:00pm

Chap Clark is professor of Youth, Family, and Culture at Fuller Seminary, President of ParenTeen, Inc., and co-interim preaching pastor at St Andrews Presbyterian Church in Newport Beach, CA.

This Faith For Life Speaker event is focused on what it means to see parenting as stewardship from God. In 2015 I was working at a job that I loved but still didn't feel like I was serving a purpose. By a fluke I applied for a job at our local United Way, but was feeling conflicted about even interviewing when I was comfortable and happy where I was. A few days before my interview we were at church, and Pastor Hans started the service by introducing us to a washing machine agitator. The sermon was about how God works to pull you in different directions—he even mentioned the scenario of being happy at your job but feeling called to take a different one. LWR SCHOOL KITS

Regardless of how long you've been around Calvary, you have likely noticed that our church's commitment to service stretches from local to global projects. This fall, Calvary people of all ages helped gather supplies to pack nearly 800 Lutheran World Relief school kits, sent around the world to children who wouldn't otherwise have them. What started during VBS, continued with Sunday School, Mission Kit packing day, and ConfirMission, bringing many hands together to collect things like pencils, rulers, and scissors. And behind the scenes, constantly buying, counting, and organizing the hundreds of supplies is a woman who has had her pulse on this and other mission projects for years—Mary Oberg.

When Mary moved back to Alexandria more than 20 years ago, she was fresh off work in the restaurant business that had taken her from Cleveland to West Palm Beach. Mary's job as a food buyer taught her the great skill of comparison shopping. Now, as a key volunteer for mission kit projects at Calvary, Mary has continued honing this skill. You'll find her asking managers at Target for cases of notebooks in the fall, at Ron's Warehouse once a week scoping out sales, and at Someplace Safe on Tuesdays when you can fill a purple bag for only \$10—her record is 93 baby items in one bag.

But Mary knows it's more than just the deal that matters. It's the community of others who come together with her during the year to make a difference in the lives of others all over the world.

SHEDDING LIGHT ON OUR CHURCH BUILDING

Calvary is busting at the seams! Because of this, the congregation commissioned the Building Exploration Team to spend the year studying our building and grounds, deferred maintenance, trends, and present and future needs. Our work has included hours of conversations, visits to other churches, reflection and study. In October, we signed a short-term exploration contract with architect Dan Miller of JLG in Alexandria to assist in planning and study.

In January, the congregation is invited to attend conversational forums on January 7 and 14, in anticipation of our Annual Congregational Meeting on January 21 between services. At that time, the BET and Church Council will seek approval to:

- Contract with an architect for long-term services for the entirety of the project.
- 2. Assemble a Build Team to come up with plans, drawings and associated costs.
