

# FROM PASTOR HANS

Dear Calvary,

We are excited to jump into an exciting new theme for the year: "Better Connected." We want to spend the year getting better connected because we believe God created us in such a way the life is simply better when we are connected! Think about it: A peanut butter sandwich isn't nearly as tasty without jelly. Laurel was half as funny without Hardie. R2D2 needed his sidekick C3PO. Tom was simply a boring cat without Jerry.

In the Bible, things were much the same. Sarah needed Abraham, Mary needed Joseph, and Adam needed Eve. The story of Cain would be nothing without Abel, Mary needed her opposite Martha, Noah loaded the boat two by two, and Jesus never traveled alone — he always brought along his pack of 12 disciples. We need each other. Life is simply better when we're connected.

Likewise, somewhere along the way we have been led to believe that faith is a personal thing. It's between you and God and its nobody elses business. But that's not what God intended. God wired us in such a way that faith grows deeper when we connect with friends with whom we get a little vulnerable, and through that vulnerability we recognize that none of us has God figured out. Instead, together we wonder about all God is up to in the Bible and our lives. We need people in our lives who take us for who we are with all our questions, our doubts, and our messiness — people with whom we can connect faith and life!

This year, again and again, you will be asked to form or join a "Connect Group." What is a Connect Group? It's a group of 8-12 people you want to spend time with who commit to meet together on an on-going basis in order to intentionally grow deeper in relationship with one another and with God. I bet you could name 8-12 people you'd love to get to know a little better. They might be Calvary members, non-members, neighbors, family or friends. It doesn't matter — everyone is welcome! I invite you to call them up. Ask them to form a Connect Group with you. We'll provide a little training and discussion guides. It's easy and I know you won't regret it.

Friends, let's start getting better connected!


# Marie Hacker

# **Connecting Amidst Loss**

Over 20 years ago, our book club was formed as a result of conversations at a Calvary Women's retreat. I doubt any of us would have envisioned meeting on a regular basis all these years later. Reading the book is optional; it's okay to just come for the company (and dessert). And it's easy to take for granted how connected you become with a group of people over time.

We have experienced loss of loved ones, empty nests, divorces, marriages, new homes, job promotions, grandchildren, retirement and so much more. Often we learn about changes in each other's lives over a glass of wine and great conversation.

On April 27th of this year, life took a major detour for me and my husband, Dave. We lost our home and almost everything in it to a fire. There was a sense of helplessness surrounding the initial event, and it's overwhelming to even begin thinking about all you need to do. As I stood in my yard that day, mostly in shock, I received text messages from members of my book club. They had reserved and paid for a cottage at Arrowwood where we could stay for a few weeks. One woman from the group even showed up with bags full of essentials for us. The fire trucks hadn't even left the yard and we had a beautiful, comfortable place to stay and a few things to get us started. The ongoing support still hasn't stopped, and words can't express how incredibly grateful we are.

Being a part of a small group allows us to get to know each other on a deeper level. It gives us an opening into each other's lives that in turn allows us to help when life brings misfortune. These women were, and continue to be, a lifeline for me. I am blessed.
