Building Renovation and Expansion Update

In May 2019, the congregation voted to support taking the next steps in the proposed building renovation and expansion project. Numerous teams of people have been busy this summer preparing for the appeal to raise necessary projects funds, and the pledge process is officially underway. In addition, much progress has been made this summer developing the architectural drawings to prepare for bids and the construction process.

The congregation will be asked to reconvene on October 13, 2019 at 9:30 am in the Sanctuary to learn the results of the appeal, see final design drawings, and hear about the phasing of the project. A vote will take place to determine if construction will begin. The building and financial teams will once again conduct forums leading up to this meeting, so watch for those dates to come soon. This proposed renovation and expansion is a response to God's call to make room for everyone so that all might know a lifelong faith in Jesus Christ. Welcome Angie Larson, Executive Minister!

Hello Calvary! On September 4, I get to join you in ministry as we together lead all people to a lifelong faith in Jesus. You are likely wondering—who is this Angie Larson? Here's a little about my story. I can't wait to get to know your story!

Faith has been a part of my whole life. Baptized as an infant to devout Christian parents, faith was modeled and expected. Prayers at dinner and bedtime, second pew sitters on Sunday mornings, church camp, volunteerism, and Sunday School. We moved a lot as a kid, five elementary schools and three high schools, because of this I always thought of church as my hometown, something that was familiar when my bedroom and schools were different.

I loved the church and I loved Jesus. I felt called by the Holy Spirit to serve in the church when I was just a teenager. I chose Valparaiso University to attend so I could double major in Theology and Social Work. This, for me, was the perfect blend of being able to care for people spiritually and emotionally. I volunteered for university chapel services and helped lead a young adult worship service. My life came to a crossroads when my boyfriend and I found out we were pregnant at 19 years old. At this point my world came crashing down. Rejected by the campus ministry leadership and pastor, encouraged to discontinue a ministry path by my advisors, I found myself grieving a calling I was pretty sure of.

At this crossroads is when the Holy Spirit took a hold of me, not like a nice dove like we see on Sunday morning paraments, but more like a hawk with talons grabbing me by the neck. This church expression wasn't my understanding of who Jesus was or what the cross meant. It didn't match the grace that I found in the gospel or the new life promised through the resurrection. This hawk Holy Spirit planted a seed of conviction in me to continue a call to ministry. I had my beautiful son, Chase, finished my degree, and was called to the first congregation I served at 22. I've served in the church ever sense.

This call to congregational ministry and parenthood hasn't been easy, but it is my hope that my children and the people I am called to serve can experience the love, grace, wholeness, and freedom that Christ offers through his work on the cross. Calvary, I'm excited to share that with all of you.
